



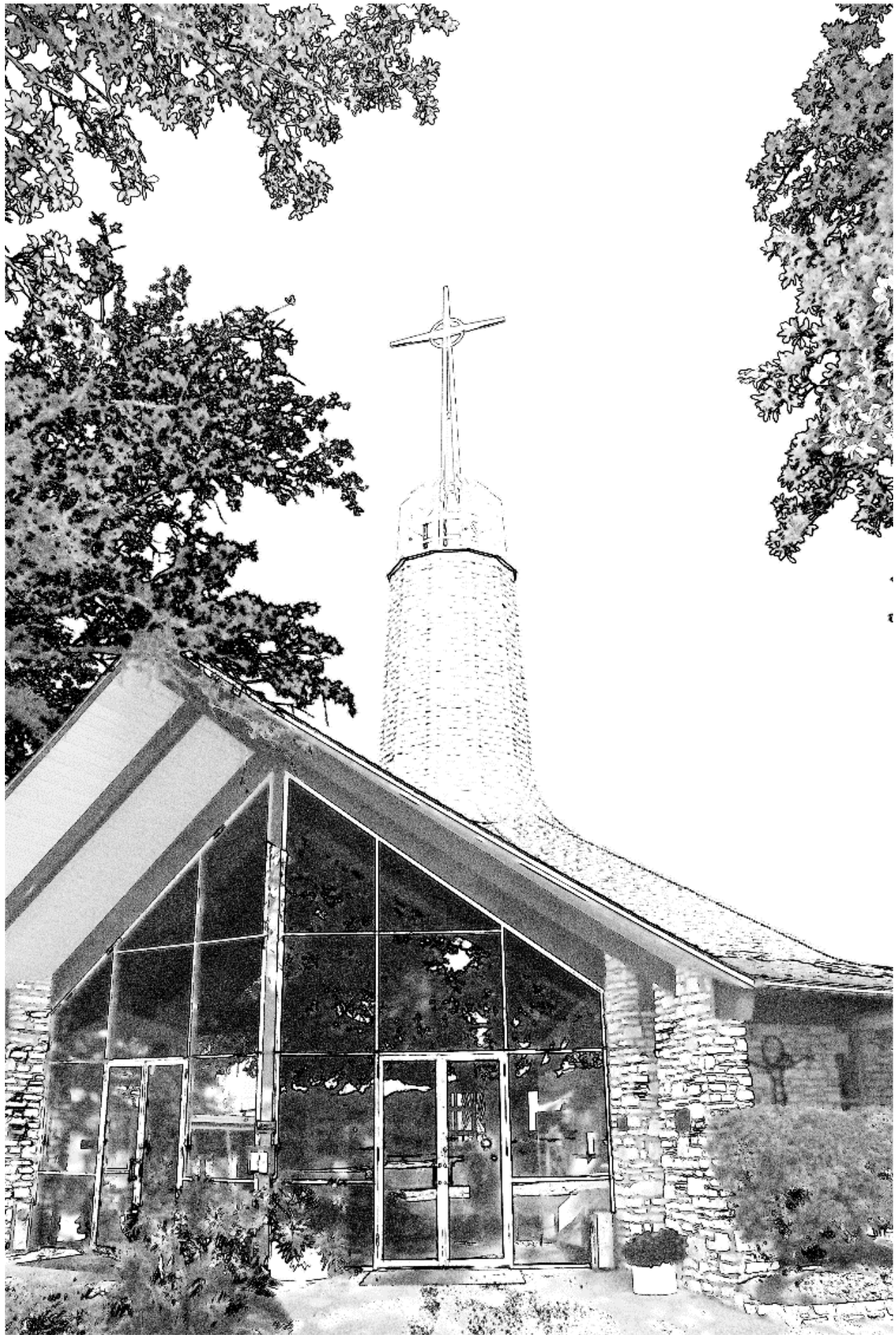

In-Person Worship: What to Expect

- Within the past 48 hours, exposure within six feet for more than 15 minutes to someone who has a confirmed/suspected case or symptoms of COVID-19

In-Person Worship Guidelines

While participating in worship, please support our efforts to minimize the spread of COVID-19 by:

- maintaining six-foot social distancing

- refraining from singing
