



THE FIFTH SUNDAY IN LENT THE HOLY EUCHARIST: RITE II SUNDAY, MARCH 21st, 2021



John 12:20-33

²⁰Now among those who went up to worship at the festival were some Greeks. ²¹They came to Philip, who was from Bethsaida in Galilee, and said to him, "Sir, we wish to see Jesus." ²²Philip went and told Andrew; then Andrew and Philip went and told Jesus. ²³Jesus answered them, "The hour has come for the Son of Man to be glorified. ²⁴Very truly, I tell you, unless a grain of wheat falls into the earth and dies, it remains just a single grain; but if it dies, it bears much fruit. ²⁵Those who love their life lose it, and those who hate their life in this world will keep it for eternal life. ²⁶Whoever serves me must follow me, and where I am, there will my servant be also. Whoever serves me, the Father will honor.

²⁷ Now my soul is troubled. And what should I say—'Father, save me from this hour'? No, it is for this reason that I have come to this hour. ²⁸Father, glorify your name." We give thanks to you, O God, for the goodness and love which you have made known to us in creation; in the calling of Israel to be your people; in your Word spoken through the prophets; and above all in the Word made flesh, Jesus, your Son. For in these last days you sent him to be incarnate from the Virgin Mary, to be the Savior and Redeemer of the world. In him, you have delivered us from evil, and made us worthy to stand before you. In him, you have brought us out of error into truth, out of sin into righteousness, out of death into life.

On the night before he died for us, our Lord Jesus Christ took bread; and when he had given thanks to you, he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, and said, "Take, eat: This is my Body, which is given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me."

After supper he took the cup of wine; and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, and said, "Drink this, all of you: This is my Blood of the new Covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Whenever you drink it, do this for the remembrance of me." Therefore, according to his command, O Father,

In-Person Worship: What to Expect

- Wear your face covering/mask except during Communion as directed [extras available in the Narthex/Lobby]
- Use hand sanitizer upon entry
- Pick up a Worship Bulletin from a Greeter or from the table near the door
- Use the COVID-19 Screening Checklist [below] to screen yourself
- Check in at the next open check-in station
- Review the In-Person Worship Guidelines [below]
- Be seated by an usher in a socially-distanced configuration in designated pews
- Remain in your seats to receive Communion
- Exit through the door nearest your section to observe social distancing

COVID-19 Screening Checklist

□ Sore throat

□ Vomiting

Diarrhea

□ New loss of taste or smell

Have you experienced any of the following symptoms/indicators of possible COVID-19 infection? ONE of these:

- □ Cough
- $\hfill\square$ Shortness of breath
- □ Within the past 48 hours, exposure within six feet for more than 15 minutes to someone who has a confirmed/suspected case or symptoms of COVID-19

OR at least TWO of these:

- □ Fever
- □ Chills
- □ Repeated shaking w/chills
- □ Muscle pain
- □ Headache

If yes, please refrain from attending worship and seek appropriate medical attention.

In-Person Worship Guidelines

While participating in worship, please support our efforts to minimize the spread of COVID-19 by:

- using hand sanitizer upon building entry and washing/sanitizing hands frequently thereafter
- wearing face coverings/masks at all times except as instructed during Communion
- □ maintaining six-foot social distancing
- \Box covering coughs
- □ refraining from singing
- using the bathroom for emergencies only [located in the Cry Room near the elevator]
- □ checking in to confirm/provide contact information for contact tracing in case of potential exposure
- □ notifying St. Luke's on the Lake immediately if:
 - o you learn that you may have been exposed to COVID-19 within 48 hours prior to the service
 - o you experience symptoms or test positive for COVID-19 within 14 days after attending the service
 - email <u>nphillips@stlukesonthelake.org</u>; your identity will be held in confidence
- acknowledging that despite our best efforts to provide a COVID-19-free environment, exposure is still a risk
