Romans 8:12-17

¹²So then, brothers and sisters, we are debtors, not to the flesh, to live according to the flesh—¹³for if you live according to the flesh, you will die; but if by the Spirit you put to death the deeds of the body, you will live. ¹⁴For all who are led by the Spirit of God are children of God. ¹⁵For you did not receive a spirit of slavery to fall back into fear, but you have received a spirit of adoption. When we cry, "Abba! Father!" ¹⁶it is that very Spirit bearing witness with our spirit that we are children of God, ¹⁷and if children, then heirs, heirs of God and joint heirs with Christ—if, in fact, we suffer with him so that we may also be glorified with him.

Can one enter a second time into the mother's womb and be born?" ⁵Jesus answered, "Very truly, I tell you, no one can enter the kingdom of God without being born of water and Spirit. ⁶What is born of the flesh is flesh, and what is born of the Spirit is spirit. ⑦Do not be astonished that I said to you, 'You must be born from above.' ⁶The wind blows where it chooses, and you hear the sound of it, but you do not know where it comes from or where it goes. So it is with everyone who is born of the Spirit." ⁰Nicodemus said to him, "How can these things be?" ¹⁰Jesus answered him, "Are you a teacher of Israel, and yet you do not understand these things?

116 Very truly, I tell you, we speak of what we know and testify to what we have seen; yet you do not receive our testimony. 12 If I have told you about earthly things and you do not believe, how can you believe if I tell you about heavenly things? 13 No one has ascended into heaven except the one who descended from heaven, the Son of Man. 14 And just as Moses lifted up the serpent in the wilderness, so must the Son of Man be lifted up, 15 that whoever believes in him may have eternal life.


Special Announcement: Updated Worship Guidance

In accordance with updated CDC guidelines for COVID-19 risk mitigation, the Bishop of the Diocese of Texas has issued new guidance to congregations for how we may come together to worship. Our Bishop Suffragan clarifies, "We expect those who are unvaccinated to continue to wear a mask. We also expect that you will manage your own responsibility for mask-wearing. There will be a designated section available for those who would feel most comfortable with distanced seating with others who choose to wear a mask."

As always, St. Luke's is committed to protecting the most vulnerable among us. We continue to follow Jesus and follow science, so we are making changes to accommodate all who participate in our worship services according to their comfort levels.

Pre-registration for services is no longer needed, and we offer two seating sections:

- The left section that continues to maintain social distancing and masking for the protection of immunocompromised and unvaccinated adults and children, and any others who prefer this arrangement
- The right section for those who are fully vaccinated and >14 days post-vaccination and are comfortable with optional social distancing and masking



On May 23rd, we repeated our Baptismal Covenant as part of the service of Confirmation—which reminds us that as Christians, we are to seek and serve Christ in all persons, loving our neighbor as ourselves; and that we are called to respect the dignity of every human being. We encourage you to remain respectful of one another no matter where you choose to sit; to support our Diocesan leadership; and to pray for those helping guide us through this pandemic towards its swift end.
