

Philippians 3:4b-14

^{4b}If anyone else has reason to be confident in the flesh, I have more: ⁵circumcised on the eighth day, a member of the people of Israel, of the tribe of Benjamin, a Hebrew born of Hebrews; as to the law, a Pharisee; ⁶as to zeal, a persecutor of the church; as to righteousness under the law, blameless.

⁷Yet whatever gains I had, these I have come to regard as loss because of Christ. ⁸More than that, I regard everything as loss because of the surpassing value of knowing Christ Jesus my Lord. For his sake I have suffered the loss of all things, and I regard them as rubbish, in order that I may gain Christ ⁹and be found in him, not having a righteousness of my own that comes from the law, but one that comes through faith in Christ, the righteousness from God based on faith. ¹⁰I want to know Christ and the power of his resurrection and the sharing of his sufferings by becoming like him in his death, ¹¹if somehow I may attain the resurrection from the dead.

You will see people sitting, standing, or kneeling depending on whether we are listening, singing, or praying. You will hear people responding during the service as prompted. Please do whatever feels comfortable.
- † **About Communion** All baptized people of any age or Christian denomination are invited to take Holy Communion.
- † **Questions?** Please ask a greeter, an usher, or anyone near you for directions or help.

Especially For Children

- † **Children of all ages are always welcome in our service.**
- † **Kinder-5th Grade "Kids' Church"** is an interactive, kid-friendly worship time that occurs during the first part of the service. Children will be welcomed at the altar at the beginning of the service, then will go to their own worship space; check the whiteboard in the Lobby for location. They will return midway through the service. Parents are always welcome to join their children for Kids' Church.
- † **Infant-Age 5** are invited to our professionally staffed childcare area in the lower level of our complex. We offer *Little Liturgy*, a worship time with lessons, using "Godly Play" and Montessori models. Ask for assistance in finding our secure check-in desk at the bottom of the stairs in Riker Hall, accessible through the double doors near the playground.
