- † **About Communion** All who have been baptized in any Christian denomination are welcome to take Holy Communion.
- † **Restrooms** are located upstairs through the "Cry Room" or downstairs at the bottom of the staircase to the right. Ask anyone for directions.
- † **Questions?** Please ask anyone near you for guidance.

As per guidance and direction from our Diocesan Bishop, the Rt. Rev. C. Andrew Doyle: the "Common Cup" is now offered. You may drink or intinct your host. If you choose to receive only the host, you will still be receiving the full sacramental benefit of the Eucharist.
