This is Year "A" of the Lectionary cycle, which rotates public reading of the entire Bible over a three-year period.
- † **About Communion** All who have been baptized in any Christian denomination are welcome to take Holy Communion.
- † **Restrooms** are located upstairs through the "Cry Room" or downstairs at the bottom of the staircase to the right. Ask anyone for directions.
