GOALS

- Practice safe and orderly evacuation of the Sanctuary and Lobby in the event of fire or other emergencies requiring evacuation
- Learn locations of emergency exits
- Learn locations of fire extinguishers
- Help Lake Travis Fire Rescue and the St. Luke's Safety/Security Task Force identify areas for improvement
- **Celebrate Pentecost with your church family**



GUIDELINES

- Follow direction of Lake Travis Fire Rescue, staff members, and usher/greeter team
- Evacuate through the exits **NEAREST YOUR LOCATION**:
 - Designated emergency exit doors in the back of the Sanctuary on the left and right sides
 - Main entry doors in the front of the Lobby
- Help anyone near you who needs additional assistance
- Do not use the elevator
- Proceed to the designated Assembly Point;
 - Assembly Point **for today's drill**: Circle Drive sidewalk *unless otherwise instructed*
 - Note: Assembly Point for a fire emergency will be recommended by LTFR after today's drill
 - **DO NOT LEAVE** until all are accounted for
 - Note: For a fire emergency, leaving in your vehicle could create traffic problems for entering emergency vehicles

NOTES

- Next steps include:
 - Review of feedback about today's fire drill from congregation and LTFR to improve future emergency response
 - Documentation and training for emergency evacuation procedures geared toward ushers, greeters, staff, professional childcare workers, and leaders in charge of groups [internal and outside] meeting on campus
 - Campus-wide fire drills during Sunday School and weekday office hours
 - Improved emergency response signage
 - Expanded emergency response equipment stations
